Re: Redacted domestic-violence restraining-order packet

Dear [CLIENT NAME REDACTED],

We looked through the documents you sent us. A few items appear worth checking before anything is filed, signed, served, or submitted for court completion, so we listed them below in the order that may be most helpful.

Here are the items that may be worth checking before the documents are filed or signed:

- The case-number fields appear blank throughout the request, hearing notice, temporary order, custody forms, and income declaration. Please check whether the packet is intended as an initial filing or whether a case number should be added to the later-use copies.
- The notice of hearing does not show a hearing date, time, department, service deadline, judicial signature, or court selections. The temporary order also leaves the hearing information, requested-order decisions, attached-page count, date, and judicial signature blank. These may be court-completion fields, but the packet may be clearer if the filer confirms that the correct court-completion versions are being submitted.
- The request form's signature line appears signed, but the date next to the signature appears blank. Please check whether the signing date should be entered.
- The request describes the event dated November 24, 2023 as the most recent abuse, while another incident is dated December 1, 2023. Please check which event was actually the most recent and make the wording or dates consistent.
- The second incident has a date field of December 1, 2023, but the narrative states that the discovery occurred on or about December 24, 2023. Please check the intended date.
- The request states that six additional pages are attached, but the packet includes a six-page custody request and a four-page income declaration after the twelve-page request. Please check what documents are being counted as additional pages and correct the stated number if needed.
- The request asks for a no-contact order and a stay-away order, while the custody request proposes joint custody and unsupervised weekly weekend visits. These entries may be intentional, but the repeated terms may be clearer if the requested contact and parenting-time arrangements are checked for consistency.
- The custody request states that the child spends half of the time with each parent, while the proposed schedule appears to provide visits from Saturday morning through Sunday evening each week. Please check whether the percentage and schedule are intended to describe the same arrangement.

- The unmonitored-visitation schedule gives a Saturday start time and a Sunday ending time, but the Saturday end and Sunday start fields are blank. The schedule may be clearer if the continuous weekend period is stated more explicitly.
- The property-debt section lists a mortgage payment with a due date in early 2023, even though the described incidents and proposed visitation dates are later in 2023. Please check whether the year in the due date was entered as intended.
- The income declaration lists an employer, a work schedule, an hourly rate, a job start date, and a job end date, while the income page reports no wages and lists disability income. These entries may describe a former job, but the form may be clearer if current employment status, hours, and income are made internally consistent.
- The income declaration says the other party lives in the household, while the restraining-order request asks for that person to move out and stay away. This may describe the present situation and requested change, but the wording may be worth checking so the timeline is clear.
- The confidential law-enforcement information form contains full birth dates, physical descriptions, a residential address, and other sensitive identifiers. It should remain separate from any public copy, and the filer may wish to confirm its handling before filing or sharing the packet.

Redacted DVRO Packet - Checklist

- ☐ Check whether a case number should appear on any of the packet copies.
- ☐ Confirm that the blank hearing and court-order fields are intended for court completion.
- ☐ Add the signing date to the request if it was omitted.
- ☐ Make the “most recent abuse” description consistent with the incident dates.
- ☐ Check the December incident date against the date stated in its narrative.
- ☐ Check the stated number of additional pages attached to the request.
- ☐ Make the no-contact, stay-away, custody, and visitation requests consistent or clearer.
- ☐ Check the equal-time percentage against the proposed weekend schedule.
- ☐ Clarify the Saturday-through-Sunday visitation period.
- ☐ Check the year in the listed mortgage-payment due date.
- ☐ Make the employment-status, work-hours, wage, and disability entries internally consistent.
- ☐ Clarify the current household arrangement and the requested move-out change.
- ☐ Keep the confidential law-enforcement information form separate from public copies.
